Institute of Healthcare Engineering and Estate Management (IHEEM)

IHEEM is a non-profit organisation founded in 1943 to bring Hospital Engineers together in a burgeoning Health Service, nationalised in 1948. It is now the foremost Institute for Engineers and Facility Managers working within the Health Service and Private Sector of the United Kingdom. IHEEM is a founder "A" Member of the International Federation of Hospital Engineering joining with five other countries to form the International Federation in May 1970. IHEEM, as a founder member of IFHE, has always taken its role within that organisation seriously, responding to requests to host and assist other member countries coming to the UK. Recently IHEEM has hosted study groups from Japan, welcomed Norwegian colleagues to its offices in Portsmouth, and assisted a Malaysian delegation looking to update standards within their own Health Service. IHEEM

is actively involved with the IFHE Europe reviewing papers for, attending, and speaking at its Conferences, as well as leading Technical Committees. IHEEM is a charitable company whose objectives are to promote for the public benefit the art and science of healthcare engineering and estate management, so far as applicable to healthcare, and to advance for the public benefit research, education and training. IHEEM is independent of government, the NHS and commercial interests, and protects its impartiality and objectivity. As a charity for research, education and training, the Institute commissions, 'for public benefit' seminars, training and educational events. Surpluses made from these events are passed through the Institute to be used to promote its charitable objectives. The Institute has a Membership of 1613 individuals plus a number of corporate members.

12 Branches are located throughout the UK plus one in Hong Kong. Branches have their own technical programmes with the majority meeting on six occasions each year, when either a technical talk is received or visits are made to local companies. IHEEM holds a very successful annual conference and exhibition which is regularly attended by over 3,000 delegates and visitors, with over 200 trade stands in the exhibition. Technical Seminars are provided to update members' knowledge on the latest Health Engineering technology and legislation. IHEEM provides its members with a comprehensive journal which is published ten times a year. IHEEM provides the Administration and Secretarial services for the International Federation of Hospital Engineering.







Overview of Healthcare in England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales

Introduction

The National Health Service began in 1948. It is funded by taxation, free of charge (except in limited circumstances sanctioned by Parliament) with a fixed budget of over £100bn available to spend on services to the whole population. NHS services deal with over 1 million patients every 36 hours. The rights to which patients, families, carers, the public, and staff are entitled, and the pledges that the NHS is committed to achieve, are set out in the NHS Constitution. The service's original focus was the diagnosis and treatment of disease. Now it plays an increasing role in both preventing ill health and improving the physical and mental health of the population. Public health services and social care services, together with NHS services comprise the healthcare system in England. Separate arrangements are in place for the devolved administrations of Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales.

System Overview

The Secretary of State for Health has responsibility to Parliament for the provision of health services. He works through the Department of Health to provide strategic direction for the NHS and the wider health and care system, and holds all of the system's national bodies to account, ensuring the parts of the system work properly together. The Department acts as `system steward'. It is the only body with oversight of the whole health and care system, its role includes setting national priorities, securing and allocating resources, sponsoring national health and care system bodies (holding them to account for delivery of their role), creating and updating policy and legislative frameworks, and accounting to Parliament, and the public, for the effectiveness of the health and care system.
