



Call for Volunteers – IFHE-EU Sustainability Working Group

Dear colleagues,

IFHE-EU is inviting its European member associations to nominate professionals interested in joining the **IFHE-EU Sustainability Working Group** – Hospital Engineering.

The Working Group has developed a 15–18-month Strategic Road Map aimed at promoting environmental, energy, economic and social sustainability across European healthcare systems and hospital infrastructures.

Its ambition is to establish IFHE-EU as a European reference point for sustainability in hospital engineering, bringing together hospital engineers, facility managers, healthcare organisations, universities, policymakers and industry representatives.

The Working Group will focus particularly on:

- energy efficiency and HVAC systems in hospitals;
- low-carbon hospitals, decarbonisation and climate neutrality;
- sustainable management of technical and biomedical systems;
- circular economy, healthcare waste and sustainable construction materials;
- digitalisation, smart hospitals and energy monitoring;
- infrastructure resilience, emergency preparedness and climate adaptation;
- life-cycle assessment, life-cycle costing and evidence-based decision-making;
- European policies, technical standards and professional capacity building.

Planned activities

Over the course of the Road Map, participants will contribute to:

- mapping European initiatives, stakeholders and best practices;
- identifying priority needs through surveys and thematic workshops;
- developing technical guidelines and practical tools for sustainable hospitals;
- defining hospital energy and environmental audit models;
- supporting pilot projects in hospitals and healthcare networks;
- organising webinars, short courses and other training activities;
- preparing policy and technical briefs, reports and a possible IFHE-EU white paper;
- disseminating results at IFHE-EU events and at the IFHE-EU Congress IHS 2027;
- contributing, where appropriate, to European standards, technical regulations, policies and funding programmes.

The Working Group will operate through a core team of approximately 7–12 members, supported by additional contributors according to the different thematic areas. Online meetings are expected to take place approximately once a month. Decisions will be consensus-based, and progress will be regularly reported to the IFHE-EU Executive Committee.



We are therefore looking for motivated professionals who are willing to contribute actively by sharing their experience, participating in meetings and workshops, supporting the preparation of technical outputs, and helping to identify good practices and pilot initiatives in their own countries.

Each IFHE-EU member association is kindly invited to circulate this call among its members and to nominate suitable candidates.

Expressions of interest should include:

- name and country;
- national association;
- organisation and professional role;
- main areas of expertise;
- preferred thematic area or activity;
- a brief statement of motivation.

1. Context and Purpose

The IFHE-EU Sustainability Working Group – Hospital Engineering area aims to promote environmental, energy, economic and social sustainability within healthcare systems and hospital infrastructures, with particular attention to the life cycle of buildings, safety, resilience, and quality of services for patients and healthcare professionals.

The Working Group acts as a European platform for dialogue and collaboration among hospital engineers, policymakers, universities and industry, fostering the integration of technological innovation, sustainable management, and healthcare policies.

Guiding Principles

- Evidence-based approach and life-cycle thinking
- Patient safety and operational continuity
- Reduction of the environmental impact of healthcare facilities
- Alignment with UN SDGs, the European Green Deal, and EU health policies
- Scalability and replicability across European healthcare systems
